Lockdowns Strike Again

The scheduled Artist Book workshop at Princes Hill Community Centre has had to be rescheduled as a result of the lockdown restrictions in Melbourne. Currently it has been rescheduled for the 4th of December, with another Eco-dye and Botanical Print workshop scheduled for the 27th of November. If restrictions prevent them going ahead on these dates they will be rescheduled for next year. Princes Hill Community Centre is also hosting Open Days on the 20th and 21st of November (restrictions permitting) and I will have some work on exhibition for viewing if you are able to get there.

On-line Workshops

I have begun work on the development of some online workshops. The first series will be on Yarn Making. These will all be able to be accessed through my website. The Yarn Making Series will have three elements. The first will be a free quick video demonstration of a yarn making process, the second will be a brief instruction video tutorial and the third will be a more comprehensive series of classes including videos and printable resources. This way you will be able to choose how much you want to learn (and how much you want to spend). After the prototype resources are completed the access interfaces will be built into the website in the workshop pages and the demonstrations, tutorials and workshops will go live. I am hoping that will be by the new year. So, watch the Newsletter for more announcements about the launch dates.
